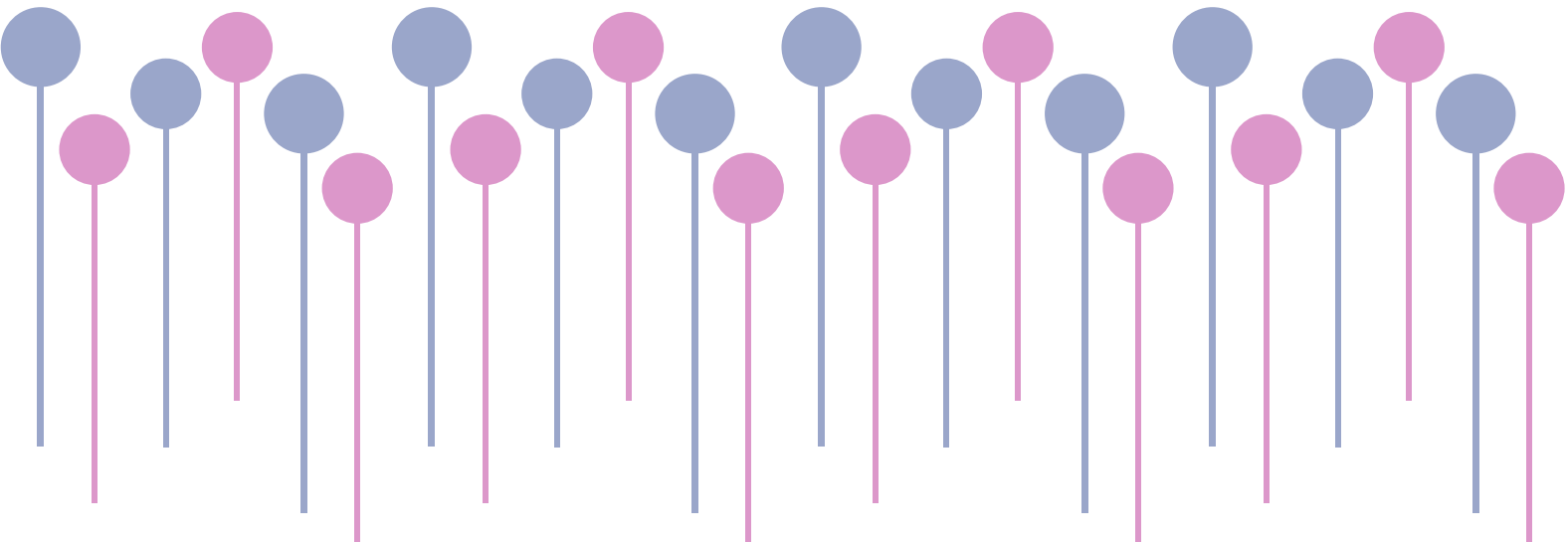




From the Principal's Desk

Literacy - Mont I

Introduction to Letters A, B, C

We are excited to introduce the very first steps in your child's literacy journey. This month, our focus will be on the letters A, B, and C. Each letter brings with it a world of fun, learning, and creativity. Here's what your child can look forward to

Letter A:

- **Activities:** We will explore the letter A through songs, stories, and games. Your child will learn to recognize and write the letter A, both in uppercase and lowercase.

Words: Apple, ant, alligator, astronaut, and airplane.

Letter B:

- **Activities:** Through engaging activities, your child will become familiar with the shape and sound of the letter B. They will practice writing it and associating it with everyday objects.

Words: Ball, butterfly, bear, boat, and banana.

Letter C:

- **Activities:** The letter C will be introduced through interactive stories, songs, and writing exercises. Your child will learn to identify and write this curvy letter.

Words: Cat, car, cake, cow, and carrot.

We encourage you to help in fun at home by pointing out these letters and their corresponding objects in your daily routine. Your involvement will make a significant difference in your child's learning experience.



ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Numeracy

Introduction to big and small, thick and thin, long and short, up and down, tall and short.

This month, we are introducing our mont I children to the wonderful world of opposites! Understanding these basic concepts helps children develop their vocabulary, comprehension, and observational skills. Here's how we will explore each pair of opposites:

Big and Small: We will compare big and small objects, such as balls, blocks, and stuffed animals. Children will learn to identify and describe the size differences between objects.

Thick and Thin:

- **Activities:** Children will explore thick and thin items like crayons, books, and sticks. We will discuss the differences and practice using the words in sentences.

- **Hands-On Learning:** Comparing the thickness of different materials, such as paper and cardboard, will be a fun and engaging activity.

Long and Short:

- **Activities:** We will measure and compare long and short objects, such as ribbons, pencils, and ropes. Children will learn to use these terms accurately.

Up and Down:

- **Activities:** We will use movements and objects to demonstrate up and down. Activities like jumping, reaching, and moving toys up and down will be part of our learning.

Tall and Short:

- **Activities:** Children will compare the height of various objects, such as blocks, plants, and towers. They will learn to use the words tall and short correctly.

We encourage you to reinforce these concepts at home by pointing out and discussing big and small, thick and thin, long and short, up and down, and tall and short objects in your surroundings. Engaging with your child in these activities will enhance their learning experience and make it more enjoyable.

General Awareness

Learning I'm special, My body, My home, My school, Self introduction, Colours.

This month, we are excited to explore themes that help our nursery children learn about themselves and the world around them. These lessons are designed to build self-awareness, self-confidence, and a sense of belonging. Here's what we will be focusing on:

I'm Special:

- **Activities:** We will celebrate each child's unique qualities. Activities will include sharing what makes them special, creating self-portraits, and talking about their favourite things.

My Body:

- **Activities:** We will learn about different parts of the body through songs, games, and hands-on activities. Children will learn the names and functions of various body parts.

- **Storytime:** Books that focus on making new friends and introductions.

Colours:

- **Activities:** Exploring different colours through interactive activities and games. Children will learn to identify, name, and categorize colours.

- **Songs and Rhymes:** Singing songs about colours to make learning fun and memorable.

We encourage you to support these themes at home by discussing what makes your child special, talking about body parts, exploring different areas of your home, discussing their

school day, practicing introductions, and identifying colours in your environment. Your involvement will enhance their learning experience and make these concepts more meaningful.



Numeracy

Learning of letter Ee - Jj

This month, our literacy lessons have been vibrant and engaging as we focused on the letters E through J. Students began with the



letter E, practicing tracing and identifying words like "elephant," "engine," and "egg." They enjoyed singing along to themed songs and writing exercises that reinforced their learning. For the letter F, we introduced fun activities like creating letter shapes, using cones and jumping through them, which helped make the learning process dynamic and interactive. The letter G was explored through tracing activities, word identification games, and crafting projects featuring words such as "goat," "grape," and "garden."

Moving on to the letter H, students participated in exciting writing exercises and sang songs about "hat," "house," and "hill." With letter I, our activities included tracing and identifying words like "ice cream," "island," and "insect." Finally, for the letter J, students jumped through cone-shaped letters and enjoyed writing and identifying words like "jungle," "juice," and "jacket." These interactive activities not only enhanced their phonetic awareness and writing skills but also made learning fun and memorable. We are delighted to see their enthusiasm and progress.

Literacy - Mont II

Learning Small and Big, Short and Long

This month in Numeracy, our focus has been on understanding, measurement and comparisons through hands-on and interactive activities. Students have been exploring concepts such as big vs. small, long vs. short, tall vs. short, heavy vs. light, and more vs. less, using a variety of engaging methods.



ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

In our **big and small** activities, students identified and compared live objects and pictures, observing the differences in size. For **long and short**, they participated in hands-on activities, measuring and comparing objects like pencils and ribbons to understand length. Our **tall and short** lessons included measuring classroom items and using visual aids to grasp height differences.

The concept of **heavy and light** was explored through weighing different objects giving students a tangible understanding of weight. **In more and less** activities, students used counters and everyday objects to practice addition and subtraction in a fun, visual way. Lastly, our **in and out** exercises involved sorting and organizing objects, helping students grasp spatial relationships through real-life experiences.

These activities not only reinforced mathematical concepts but also encouraged active learning through hands-on experiences. We're excited to see our students developing a deeper understanding of measurements and comparisons while having fun in the process.

General Awareness

Building Awareness: Exploring Our School, Class, and Social Skills.
