Literacy - Mont I

Introduction to Letters D, E, F

- **Letter I**

Activities: The letter I will be introduced through interactive stories, songs, and writing exercises. Your child will learn to identify and write this curvy letter.

Words: Igloo, Insect, Ice cream, Ice.

- **Letter J**

Activities: The letter J will be introduced through interactive stories, songs, and writing exercises. Your child will learn to identify and write this curvy letter.

Words: Jug, Jam, Jelly, Jar.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Introduction to K, L, M, N letters

This month, our little learners are having a blast exploring the wonderful world of letters! We've been focusing on the letters **K, L, M, and N**, and the children have been engaging in fun activities to help them recognize, write, and sound out these letters.

- **Letter K** - We've learned that "K" is for **kangaroo, kite, and key**. The children enjoyed jumping like kangaroos and flying imaginary kites in class!
- **Letter L** - With "L," we've discovered **lion, lemon, and leaf**. The kids loved roaring like lions and tasting some tangy lemon treats during snack time!

Numeracy - Introduction to Numbers 3 and 4 Mont I

In our class this month, we have begun the exciting journey into the world of numbers! We are focusing on the introduction of numbers 3 and 4, setting the foundation for early mathematical skills.

Learning Through Fun and Play Our young learners were introduced to numbers 3 and 4 through a variety of engaging activities. 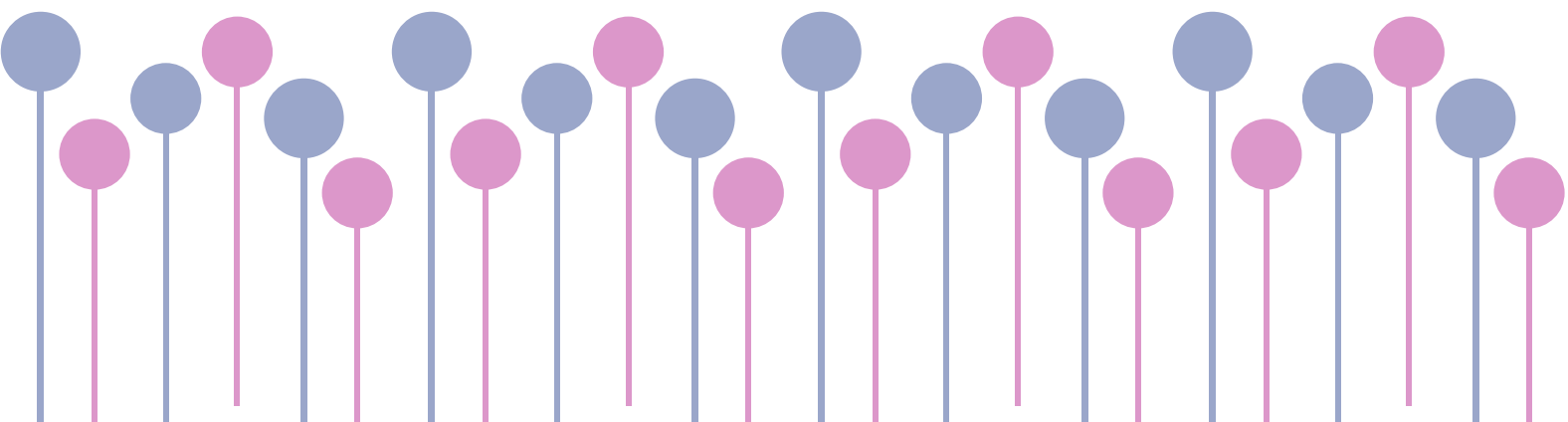
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These hands-on activities helped the children build a deeper understanding of animals, while also developing their language skills and imagination.

This skill is crucial for decoding unfamiliar words, improving reading comprehension, and fostering confidence in language learners.

In the classroom, blending words can be introduced through engaging activities, such as

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word building, sound sorting, and reading aloud. Teachers can utilize visual aids like word cards, magnetic letters, or interactive whiteboards to demonstrate sound combinations. For instance, blending "pl" and "ant" forms "plant," while combining "gl" and "ass" creates "glass." As students master blending, they unlock a treasure trove of words, empowering them to tackle complex texts and articulate expressions with ease.

By incorporating blending exercises into language learning, educators equip students with a fundamental skill that bolsters reading accuracy, vocabulary growth, and overall literacy development. As students hone their blending skills, they become proficient readers, unlocking the doors to a lifelong love of learning and exploration.

Numerecy - Tens and ones Mont III

"Tens and Ones" is a fundamental math concept that helps students understand place value and basic addition facts.

This month, our Mont III students embarked on an exciting mathematical journey, exploring the concept of Tens and Ones.

The concept of "Tens and Ones" is a fundamental building block in mathematics, enabling students to understand place value and develop essential addition skills. Tens



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represent groups of 10, denoted by the digit in the tens place, while Ones signify individual units, represented by the digit in the ones place. This concept allows students to break down numbers into manageable parts, facilitating calculations and comprehension.

For instance, the number 14 can be decomposed into 1 ten and 4 ones, while 27 consists of 2 tens and 7 ones. This understanding helps students visualize numbers, making addition and subtraction more accessible. Utilizing base-ten blocks, number lines, and hundreds charts further reinforces this concept, promoting mental math calculations and laying the groundwork for regrouping and multi-digit operations.

By mastering "Tens and Ones," students establish a solid foundation in mathematics, unlocking the doors to more advanced concepts and fostering a deeper understanding of numerical relationships.

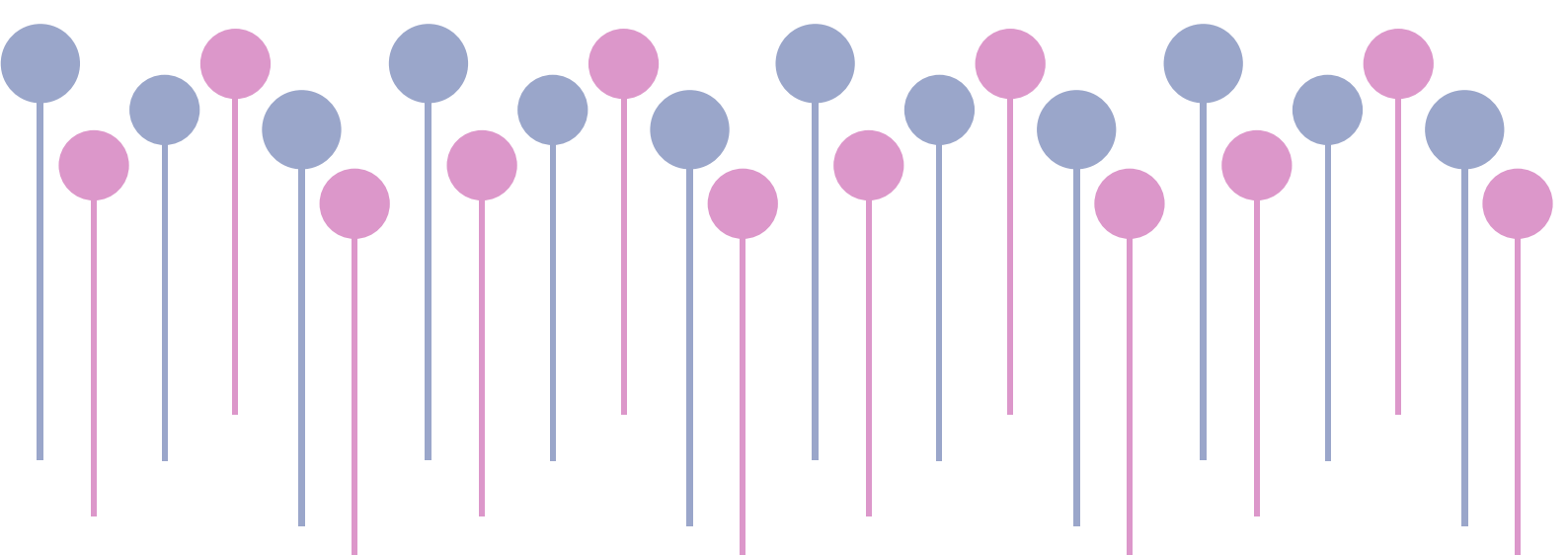
