

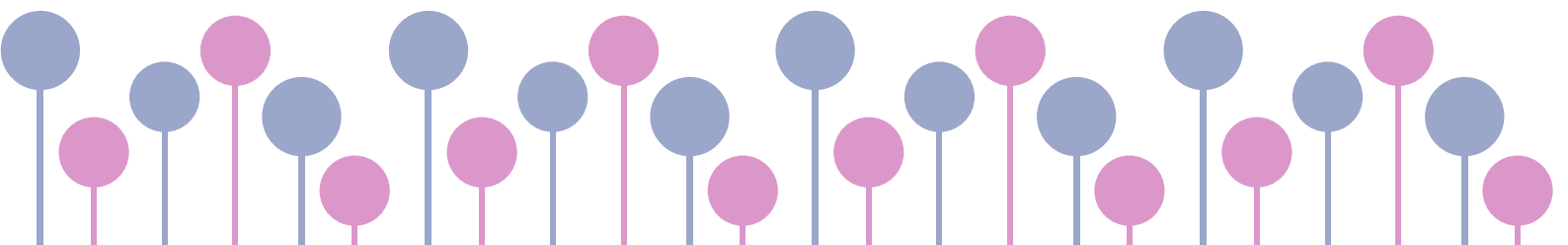


From the Principal's Desk

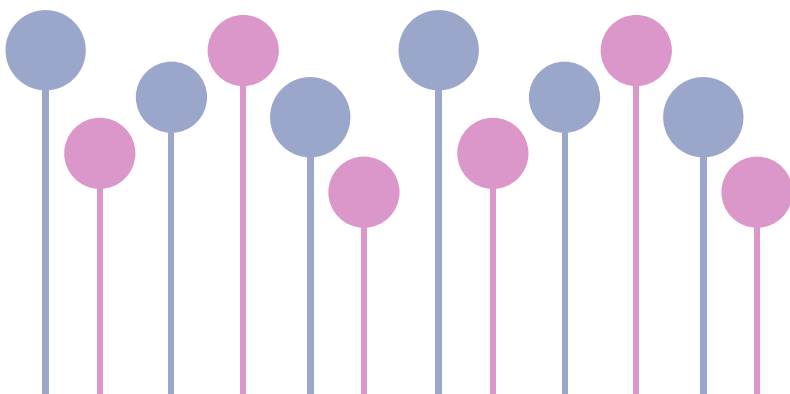

Literacy - Introduction to Letter C, D, E, F - Mont I to III

This month in Mont I, our little learners were joyfully introduced to the letters C, D, E, and F through a range of exciting, hands-on activities. Each letter was brought to life with fun stories, colorful flashcards, rhymes, and creative craftwork.

For C, children explored words like cat, car, and cup. They enjoyed a “C is for Cake” art activity coloring.

With D, they discovered dog, drum, and doll. Our learners had a great time mimicking the sound of a drum and coloring a duck.

When introduced to E, they enthusiastically learned words such as elephant, egg, and envelope. Tracing letter E for Envelope color! For F, words like fish, fan, and frog were taught using visual aids and songs. The children loved the finger-painting of a fish to reinforce the sound and shape of the letter.

These interactive sessions not only enhanced letter recognition and phonetic awareness but also developed fine motor skills and vocabulary. It was heartwarming to see our little stars confidently identifying and sounding out each letter. We look forward to continuing this joyful journey through the alphabet!

Numeracy Skill - Introduction to Number 3, 4, 5 - Mont I

In our Mont I Math's sessions, our little learners were introduced to the numbers 3, 4, and 5 through exciting and interactive activities designed to build number recognition and counting skills.

Children actively participated in hands-on learning by using number cards and colorful counters. They arranged each number card and matched it with the correct quantity of counters—laying 3 counters for number 3, 4 counters for number 4, and 5 counters for number 5. This engaging activity helped reinforce the concept of quantity and one-to-one correspondence.

Children developed early numeracy skills, fine motor coordination, and a joyful approach to learning numbers through this simple yet effective activity. Seeing them confidently identify numbers and proudly count out the correct sets was a delight!

General Awareness - Parts of The Body and Visit to The Park - Mont I

Our curious little learners were introduced to the topic “Parts of the Body” through a blend of music, movement, and hands-on learning. ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Literacy - Letters E, F, G, H Mont II

This month, our curious learners joyfully explored the letters E, F, G, and H, engaging in interactive recognition and phonics-based activities that made learning both fun and memorable. Through stories, rhymes, and colorful flashcards, children strengthened their understanding of sounds while practicing tracing and writing each letter with enthusiasm. Mathematics - Numbers 11-20, Before - After - Between, Concepts (Long/ Short, Tall/Short, Heavy/light) Mont II

Our little mathematicians stepped ahead into learning numbers 11-20 and practiced identifying the numbers that come before, after, and between. Using hands-on objects and number games, they also discovered interesting concepts like long and short, tall and short, heavy and light, helping them relate maths to real-life experiences with joy and confidence. Through activities such as arranging blocks, comparing heights, and weighing objects, the children gained a better understanding of these concepts. These hands-on explorations encouraged logical thinking and strengthened their foundational numerical skills.

This month, children enhanced their vocabulary and phonics skills by learning word families such as -ag, -am, -ay, -ar, -a, and -an. They practiced blending and reading these words with confidence. Along with this, students enjoyed the activity “When I Grow Up”, where they expressed their dreams and aspirations through simple sentences, helping them build creative thinking and speaking skills. In handwriting, children were introduced to cursive letters I, J, K, and L, practicing neat strokes and improving their writing fluency.



ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Mathematics - Measurement (Tall/short, Heavy/light), Missing Numbers, Greater Than/lesser Than/equal To, Before-After-Between Numbers - Mont III

In Math, children explored the concepts of tall and short, heavy and light, building an understanding of measurement through comparison. They practiced missing numbers to strengthen number sense and also learned the symbols and usage of greater than, less than, and equal to. Activities on identifying numbers that come before, after, and between helped students reinforce sequencing skills in a fun and engaging way.

General Awareness All About Me, My Favorite, Sense Organs, My Family, My School & School Safety Rules - Mont III

In General Awareness, children learned through interesting topics like All About Me and My Favorite, which helped them share about themselves with confidence. They explored the sense organs and their functions with interactive activities. A fun activity with family encouraged bonding and expression. Students also learned about My School and understood important safety rules at school, making them more responsible and aware of their surroundings.



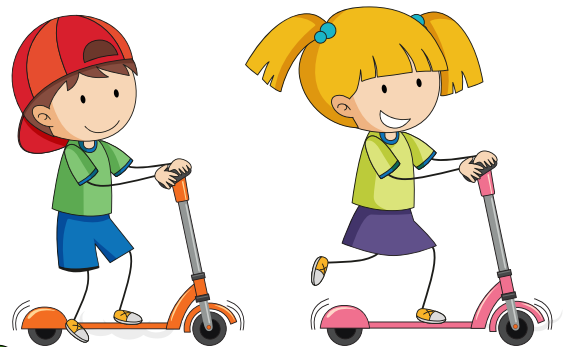
ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

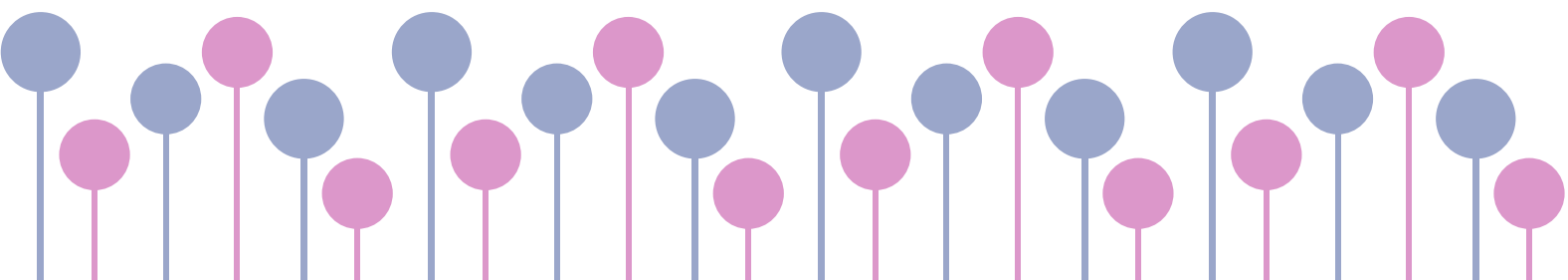
