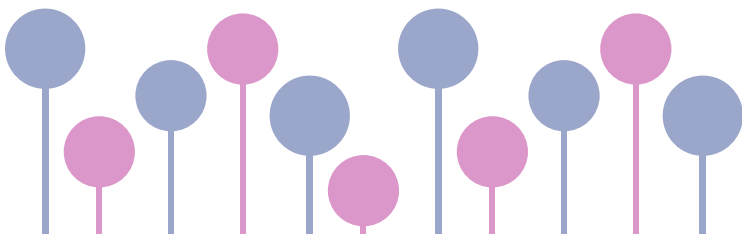
International Tiger Day

Student's Activity

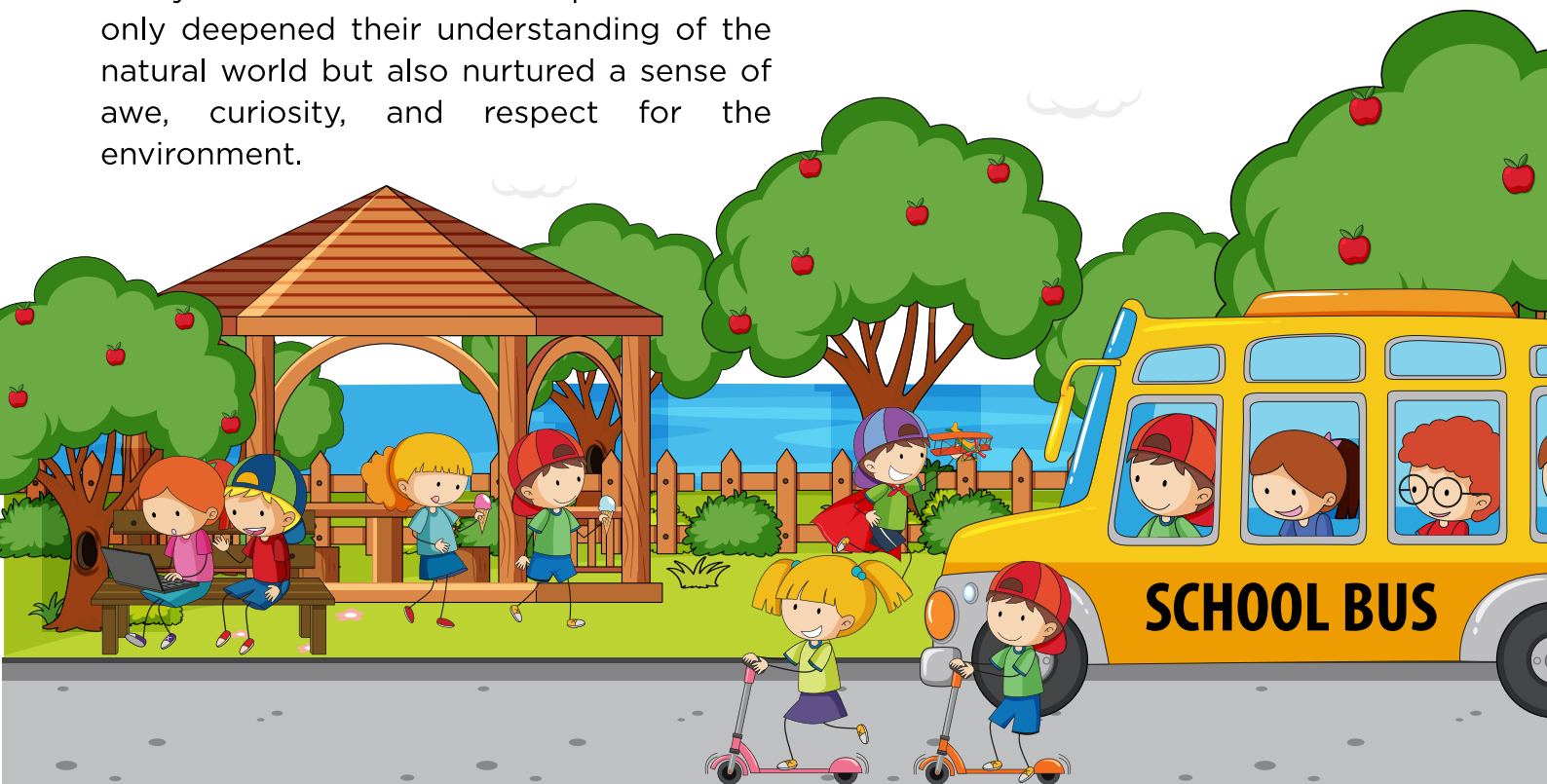
