

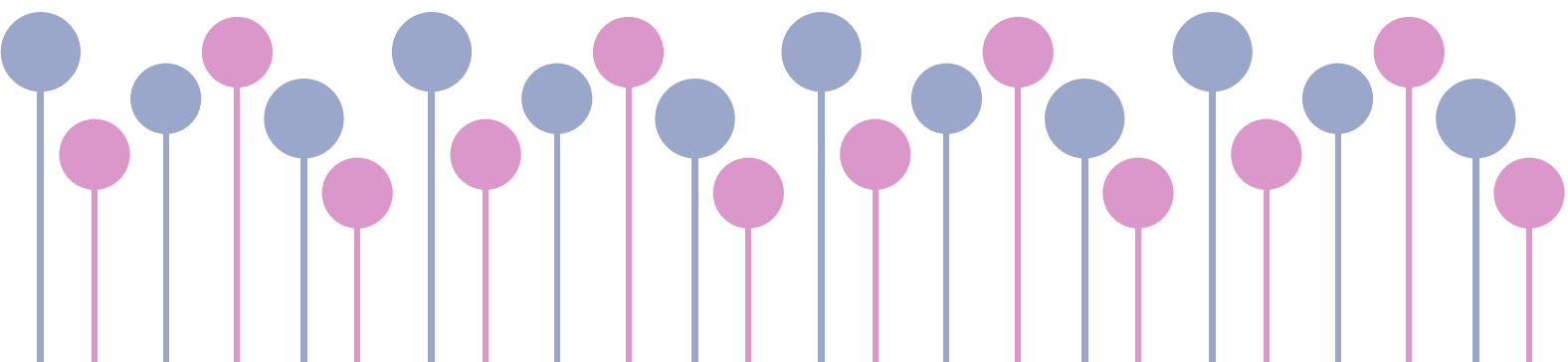


## From the Principal's Desk

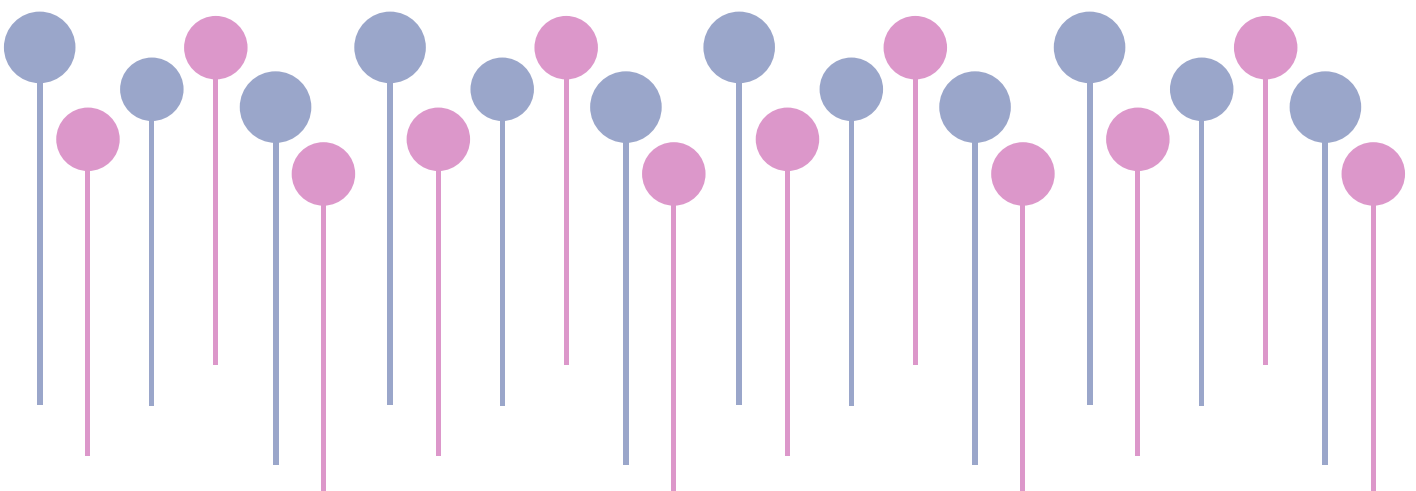
### “Educationalism”

## ACTIVITIES

### Hands on Activities

#### Tracing textured lines Activity - Mont I

Pre-writing skills are crucial for nursery-aged children, forming the basis for future writing abilities. Tactile patterns provide a sensory-rich way to develop these skills, using textures and materials to create shapes and lines. For this activity, we used yarn on cardboard to make zigzag and other line patterns. Children traced these textured lines with their fingers, allowing them to sense and feel the patterns.



#### Shapes game Activity - Mont II

The learning objective of a shapes game is to help students distinguish between various shapes and recognize their unique features. It enhances hand-eye coordination and dexterity through shape-sorting and manipulation activities, laying a foundation for understanding complex math concepts in the future. Playing shape games supports cognitive, social, and emotional growth, benefiting overall development.

## Arrange the pattern Activity - Mont III

Mont III students participated in a hands-on activity, arranging shape pattern flashcards with corresponding cutouts. They matched squares, circles, triangles, and rectangles with enthusiasm, developing problem-solving skills and hand-eye coordination. As they explored and extended patterns, they deepened their mathematical thinking and spatial awareness. This interactive activity made abstract concepts engaging, setting a strong foundation for future math skills.
