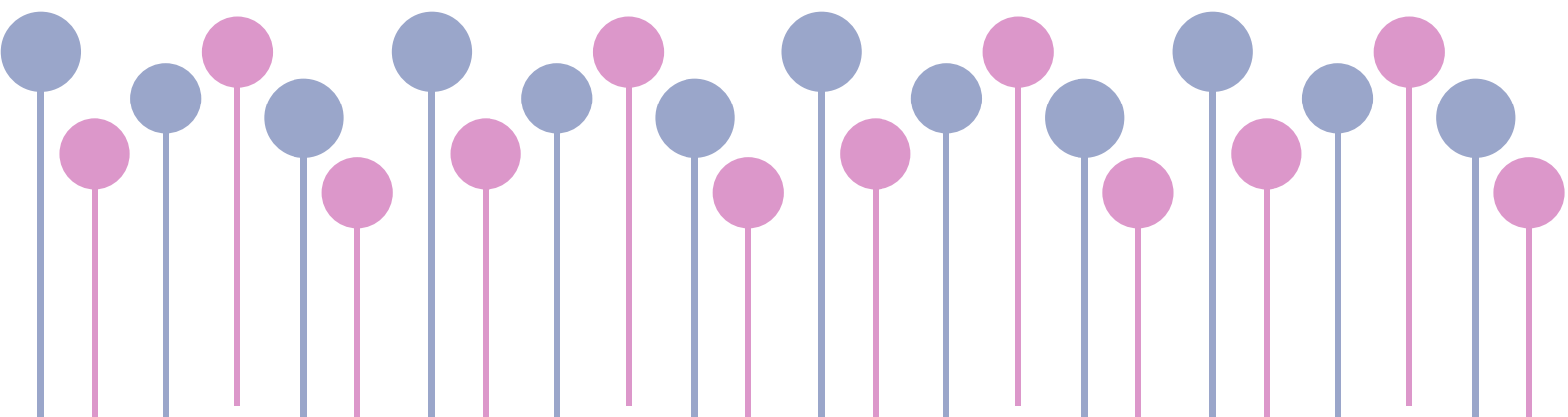
Sunshine in Little Hearts

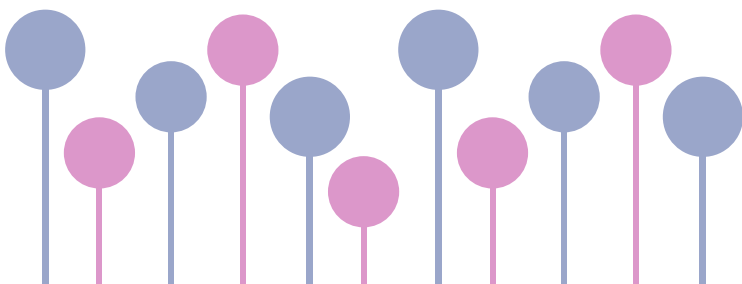
Making Letter 'B' by Using Blocks - Mont II

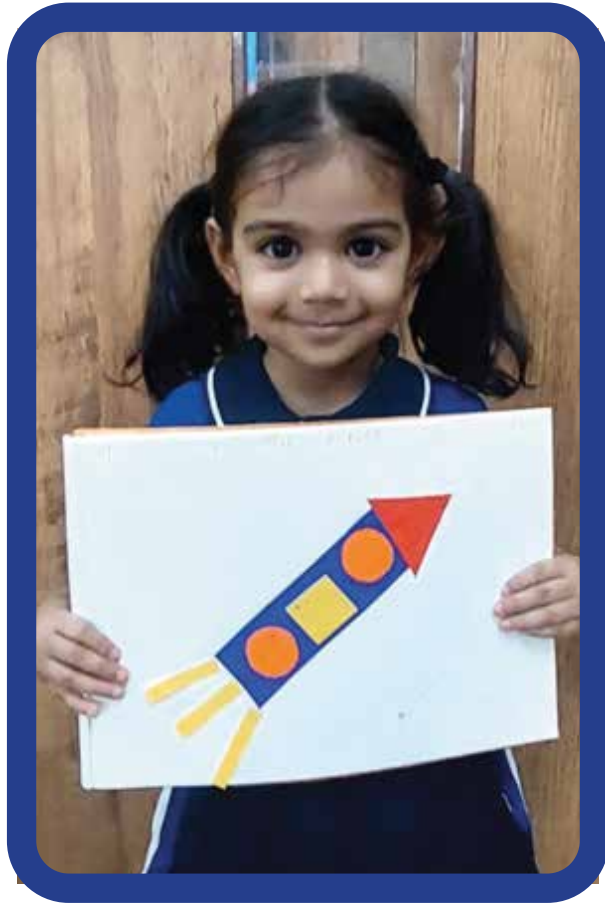


Math - Identifying Before and After numbers Mont III

Monsoon Safety: Hygiene Tips for Children
