Dear Little Learners and Parents,

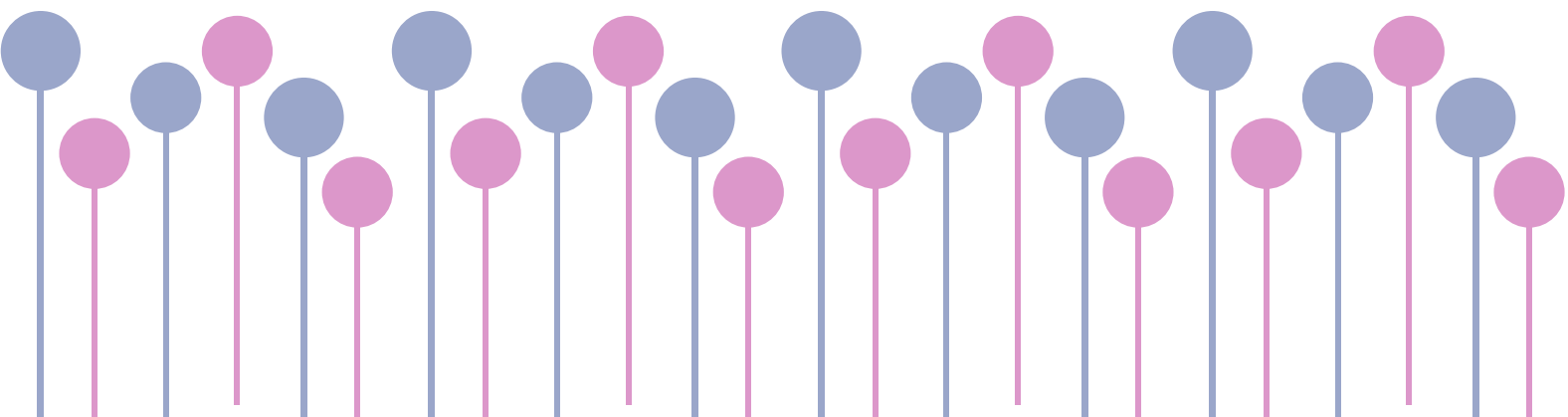
This month, we are celebrating a very special word — **Fortitude!** It may sound big, but it means something very simple and strong — **being brave and calm, even when something feels a little hard.**
