



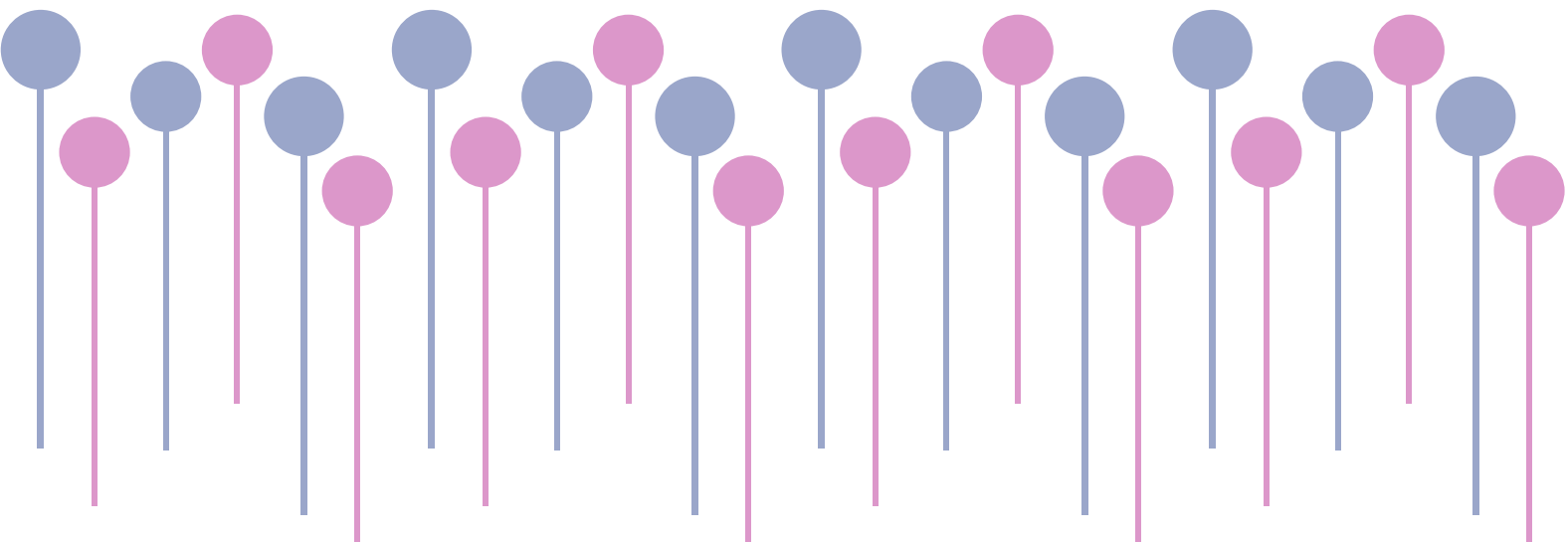
From the Principal's Desk

Star of the Week

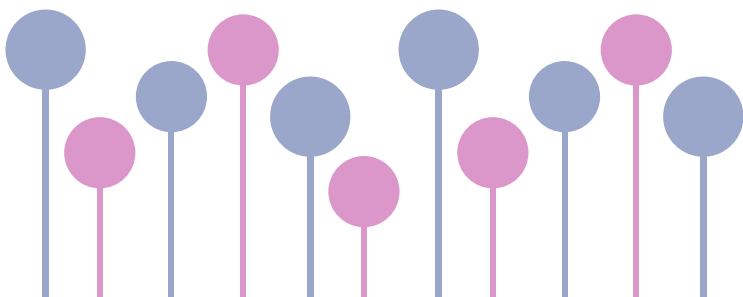
A child was honored weekly, with parents attending. Teachers highlighted unique qualities, fostering confidence and appreciation of individuality.
