



Quality Circle Time

The benefits of Circle Time extend beyond the classroom, instilling essential life skills such as turn-taking, respectful communication, and empathy. Each session concludes with a moment of gratitude or reflection, allowing students to leave with a positive and enriching experience. This helps cultivate a mindset of appreciation and mindfulness.


Family Tree Exploration - Montessori III
