It's in standing together that we find shared shelter, purpose, and a beautifully diverse harmony.




ARTICLE FROM COORDINATOR

The focus for the month was the introduction and reinforcement of the letters Ff, Gg, and Hh, using a thoughtful multi-sensory approach that enhanced both understanding and retention.

To promote letter recognition and correct formation, the children took part in a variety of hands-on activities such as air tracing, play-dough modelling, and writing in semolina trays. These exercises not only made learning fun and tactile but also supported the development of fine motor skills and muscle memory.







The children further practised individual writing of each letter within the lines, paying attention to correct stroke order and pencil grip. In addition, they were introduced to the phonic sounds of each letter along with related vocabulary, brought to life through storytelling, flashcards, and visual aids.
