When children are encouraged to explore, imagine, and question, their hidden potential begins to shine. With the right guidance and support, their curiosity transforms into confidence and growth.




ARTICLE FROM COORDINATOR

National Milk Day Celebration Learning, Creativity & Awareness

Ryan International Academy, Hinjawadi, celebrated National Milk Day on 26th November 2025 with great enthusiasm through an informative special assembly and engaging creative activities for Montessori I to III students.

The day began with a meaningful special assembly highlighting the importance of milk in our daily diet. Through simple speeches, songs and creative presentations, students learnt about the nutritional benefits of milk, including strong bones, good health and overall growth. Children also understood why milk is considered a complete food and were encouraged to develop healthy eating habits while appreciating the hard work and dedication of our dairy farmers.

To reinforce learning through fun, a series of creative competitions were organised across Montessori classes. Mont I students participated in a Tracing and Colouring Competition, where they beautifully traced and coloured a cow and confidently spoke a few lines about it. Mont II learners showcased their creativity in a Milk Glass Craft Competition, designing delightful glass-of-milk crafts using cotton and cut-outs. Mont III students impressed everyone with their Drawing and Colouring Competition, independently illustrating and colouring a cow with great focus and creativity.



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A special highlight of the day was “The Journey of Milk” storytelling session, where teachers narrated how milk travels from farms to our homes, making the learning experience both enjoyable and educational.

The celebration of National Milk Day was a perfect blend of awareness, creativity and joy, leaving students enriched with knowledge and happy memories.

Learning Math Through Play

Learning mathematics in Montessori becomes truly exciting when children explore numbers through play and hands-on experiences. Such activities help young learners naturally understand key concepts like counting, addition, shapes and patterns, while building confidence and curiosity.

To introduce the concept of addition in an engaging way, Montessori students participated in a fun classroom activity called “Counting with Objects.” Using small items such as buttons, blocks and sticks, the teacher presented two separate groups; for example, 3 sticks and 2 sticks. The children first counted each group individually and then combined them to find the total, helping them understand that addition means putting groups together.

To extend learning beyond the classroom, students also enjoyed outdoor addition activities using natural materials like leaves and flowers. Simple examples such as 3 flowers + 2 flowers = 5 flowers made learning joyful and meaningful, while strengthening early number skills.

These hands-on activities supported children’s visual, tactile and thinking skills, making mathematics less abstract and more enjoyable. Through play-based learning, Montessori students discovered that maths can be fun, interactive and full of real-life connections.

Letter Learning Through Creative Activities – Mont I

Our little Mont I learners enthusiastically participated in a series of letter-based activities that made alphabet learning both fun and meaningful. These engaging experiences helped strengthen letter recognition while encouraging creativity and fine motor development.

O for Orange

Children were introduced to the letter O through a delightful “O for Orange” craft activity.



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They pasted and decorated an orange shape, helping them understand the round formation of the letter while connecting it with a familiar fruit.

P for Pig

The learners then explored the letter P with an adorable “P for Pig” craft. By pasting different parts of the pig and adding details, the children enhanced their fine motor skills and built confidence in identifying the letter P.

Q for Quail - Paper Pasting Activity

To learn the letter Q, students created a beautiful quail using a paper-pasting activity on an A4 sheet. Sticking colourful paper pieces helped improve hand-eye coordination, creativity and focus.

These thoughtfully planned activities not only supported alphabet recognition but also nurtured motor skills, creativity and confidence in young learners. We are proud of the enthusiasm shown by our Mont I students and their growing love for learning.

Star of the Week

At Ryan International Academy, Hinjawadi, motivational activities play a vital role in guiding our Montessori students' behaviour, emotions, and learning in positive ways. One such cherished activity is “Star of the Week”, designed to encourage positive behaviour, build confidence, and nurture self-esteem.

Children are naturally drawn to praise, recognition, and rewards, and being acknowledged for their efforts or kindness makes them feel proud and valued. As a result, they are eager to try new tasks and actively participate in a variety of classroom activities.



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Every Friday, the Star of the Week activity is conducted, inviting the selected child's parents to school. The day begins with a warm welcome by the students, followed by engaging and fun activities that parents and children enjoy together. These include paper crafts, interactive games such as Lemon and Spoon, rhymes, dance, and collaborative sessions, all designed to foster joy, learning, and bonding.

The children are always excited and full of anticipation to discover who will be chosen as the Star of the Week. Activities like these not only celebrate each child's achievements but also create memorable moments of connection, learning, and happiness for both students and their families.

Quality Circle Time

At Ryan International Academy, Hinjawadi, our Montessori students enthusiastically participated in this month's QCT (Quality Circle Time) sessions based on the engaging themes "My Favourite Vehicle," "My Secret Wish," "Healthy Food," and "I Like to Eat... for Breakfast." These topics provided a wonderful platform for children to express their thoughts confidently and creatively using simple vocabulary and imaginative ideas.

Students spoke excitedly about their favourite vehicles, from cars and buses to aeroplanes and bicycles, sharing the reasons behind their choices. The theme "My Secret Wish" brought out delightful surprises, as children shared their adorable dreams of becoming superheroes, owning pet animals, or going on magical adventures.

The session on healthy food helped students



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identify fruits, vegetables, milk, and other nutritious foods, encouraging awareness of good eating habits. They also proudly spoke about their favourite breakfast choices, such as idli, poha, parathas, eggs, and sandwiches.

Health, Safety and Child Protection (HSCP) Practices



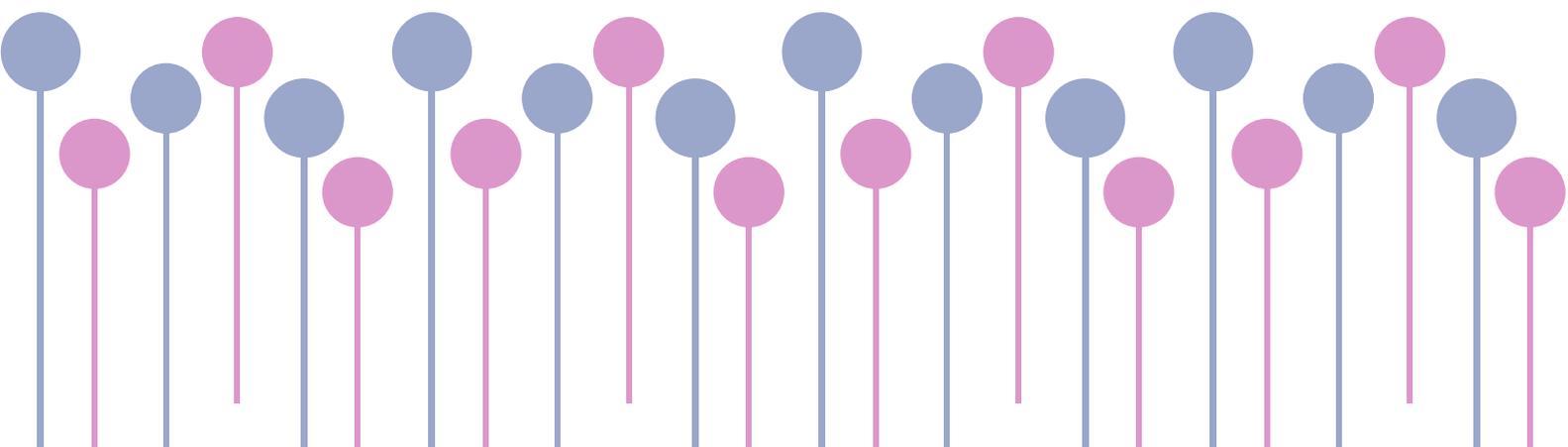
HSCP and No Corporal Punishment Training Conducted for All Staff – Second Term

The school successfully conducted the Health, Safety and Child Protection (HSCP) and No Corporal Punishment Training for the Second Term of the Academic Year 2025-26 on 18th November 2025. The session was led by the HSCP Coordinator, Ms Megha Madhavan, with active participation from all staff members, reinforcing the school's continued commitment to providing a safe, supportive and child-centred learning environment.

During the training, staff were guided through key policies, procedures and best practices related to student well-being, safeguarding protocols, emergency procedures and the emergency matrix. The session strongly reiterated the school's zero-tolerance policy towards corporal punishment, emphasising the use of positive discipline strategies that encourage respect, empathy and constructive behaviour management.

The HSCP Coordinator facilitated engaging discussions and shared practical examples to help staff identify potential risks, respond appropriately to safety concerns and uphold their responsibilities as guardians of children's rights and well-being.

By strengthening awareness and ensuring consistent practices across the school, the training plays a vital role in maintaining an environment that is safe, nurturing and free from harm. The school remains steadfast in upholding the highest standards of care and protection for all learners.


Second Quarter Anti-Bullying Committee Meeting


