Classroom Activities

Exploring Mathematics Through Hands-On Learning

Mathematics came alive in the classrooms of Ryan International Academy, Hinjawadi this month as students from Grades I to IX engaged in interactive and creative activities designed to make abstract concepts tangible and fun.

In Grade I, students played number games involving forward and backward counting from 1 to 50 and a before-after-between

circle activity. They also worked in groups to identify numbers using tens and ones representation, reinforcing their understanding of place value. Grade II students explored the value of three-digit numbers using blocks and enhanced their addition skills through a dice-based game. These tasks built a strong numerical foundation and promoted critical thinking.

Grade III learners played a collaborative addition game called *Passing the Question*, which promoted mental arithmetic and teamwork. In Grade IV, students wrote their own word problems and exchanged them with peers, merging storytelling with problem-solving. Grade V students explored 3D geometry by experimenting with cube nets—cutting, folding, and testing shapes to understand spatial structure.

In Grade VI, students visualised multiplication through grid sheets, learning about area and number patterns through rows and columns. Grade VII investigated corresponding angles using capital letters such as F, Z, and H, applying their understanding of parallel lines and transversals in a novel way.

Grade VIII discovered the exterior angle property of triangles through precise measurement with protractors, reinforcing geometric rules through practical observation. In Grade IX, students explored the concept of planes using paper models and props. Working in groups, they analysed relationships between points, lines, and planes in three-dimensional space, making abstract geometry more accessible and meaningful.

These immersive activities across the grades showcased that maths is not just about numbers—it's about patterns, reasoning, creativity, and collaboration. Our students not only strengthened their mathematical skills but also developed confidence and a love for learning through every hands-on experience.

हवा की मुश्किल – पिनव्हील निर्माण

कक्षा IV के छात्रों ने "हवा की मुश्किल" विषय के अंतर्गत एक अनोखी गतिविधि में भाग लिया, जिसमें उन्होंने रंगीन कागज़, पिन और सींक की मदद से आकर्षक पिनव्हील (चकरी) बनाई। इस गतिविधि के माध्यम से बच्चों ने हवा की दिशा को पहचानना सीखा। जब उन्होंने पिनव्हील को बाहर हवा में घुमाया, तो उन्होंने महसूस किया कि हवा किस दिशा से चल रही है। इस प्रकार, यह गतिविधि विज्ञान की अवधारणाओं को सरल और रोचक ढंग से समझाने में सफल रही।

खिलौनेवाला – नाट्य रूपांतरण

कक्षा VII के छात्रों ने पाठ 3 "खिलौनेवाला" का नाट्य रूपांतरण प्रस्तुत किया। इस मंचन ने बच्चों को अभिनय के माध्यम से पाठ की गहराई को समझने, भावनाओं को व्यक्त करने और संवाद कौशल विकसित करने का सशक्त अवसर दिया। बच्चों ने नाटक के माध्यम से सेवा, करुणा और परोपकार के मूल्य आत्मसात किए। इस गतिविधि ने उनमें आत्मविश्वास, टीमवर्क और भाषा पर पकड़ को भी बढ़ावा दिया।

पुराने डिब्बों से गुल्लक बनाना

Mystery of Science

As part of the Passion Building initiative at Ryan International Academy, Hinjawadi, the Mystery of Science Club continued to ignite curiosity and creativity among students throughout June. The club provided an engaging platform for young learners to explore scientific concepts through exciting hands-on experiments.

This month, students enthusiastically participated in various fascinating activities, including balloon rocket launches to understand air pressure, the magic milk experiment to observe chemical reactions, and the climbing colours experiment using turmeric, vinegar, and detergent. They also explored soil testing, paper chromatography, pendulum swings, and float-and-sink challenges to grasp concepts like density and material properties. These interactive experiments helped students bridge theoretical knowledge and everyday experiences in a fun and meaningful way.

A notable highlight was creating homemade lava lamps using oil, water, and effervescent tablets, vividly demonstrating liquid separation and gas release. The bubbling effects captivated the students, prompting insightful discussions on liquid interactions. Through these sessions, our young scientists honed their critical thinking, observation skills, and confidently presented their findings.

Foreign Language - French

At Ryan International Academy, Hinjawadi, the French Vocational Initiative continues to enrich language learning through a structured, engaging, and progressive approach tailored for Grades I to VIII. The June sessions were thoughtfully designed to nurture linguistic confidence, cultural awareness, and communication skills through age-appropriate themes and immersive activities.









In Grades I to III, students explored basic French greetings, numbers, days of the week, and introductory phrases. These concepts were reinforced through songs, chants, storytelling, and visual prompts making language acquisition joyful and intuitive. Grade IV and V advanced their vocabulary through practical topics such as food, family, and daily routines, with an emphasis on pronunciation, sentence structure, and guided dialogues.

Students in Grades VI to VIII delved into more advanced linguistic elements, including grammar rules, comprehension passages, peer conversations, and cultural comparisons. Activities such as role play, vocabulary games, and French song recitation fostered active participation and deepened engagement with the language.

This month's initiative not only strengthened academic proficiency in French but also helped develop key 21st-century skills such as critical thinking, collaboration, and global citizenship. It laid a strong foundation for students to appreciate linguistic diversity and to communicate confidently in a global context.

Innovation

June, has been a month filled with creativity, innovation, and discovery at Ryan International Academy, as our young learners engaged enthusiastically in various STEM-based projects.

Grade I: Students ventured into meteorology through the "My Weather Station" project, designing wind vanes, rain gauges, and barometers. Through hands-on exploration, they learned to measure and understand different weather conditions, sparking a deeper interest in weather observation.

Grade II: Students discovered principles of fluid pressure by participating in the "Fluid









Pressure Strength Game" and constructing a hydraulic arm. These activities vividly illustrated how fluids create force and motion, introducing essential engineering concepts through interactive play.

Grade III: Our young scientists explored modern agriculture with the "Innovative Farming - Hydroponics" project, understanding how plants grow without soil using nutrient-rich water. This engaging activity highlighted sustainable farming solutions, technology's role in agriculture, and solutions for future food challenges.

Grade IV: Students explored electronics through circuit simulations with Tinkercad and built wireless control systems using relays and IR sensors. This experience reinforced foundational concepts in electrical engineering, emphasising practical applications of wireless technology.

Grade V: Students embarked on the "Wireless Power Transmission" project by experimenting with a Tesla coil, learning how electricity can be transmitted without wires. They gained insights into electromagnetic fields, resonant inductive coupling, and Nikola Tesla's revolutionary work.

Grade VI: Through the "Faraday's Flashlight" project, students converted mechanical motion into electrical energy, exploring electromagnetism and Michael Faraday's innovative principles. They learned about sustainable ways to generate power without batteries.

Grade VII: Students investigated sustainable energy solutions in the "Piezoelectric Energy Harvesting" project, converting mechanical pressure into electrical energy. This interactive experience emphasised renewable energy sources and practical applications of energy harvesting.

Grade VIII: In the spirit of environmental care,









students designed an "Automated Water Dispenser for Birds and Pets", utilising sensor technology for automated water distribution. This activity combined engineering, innovation, and environmental responsibility, highlighting practical applications of automation.

Reflecting on these innovative projects, June was truly a month of meaningful STEM learning. Our young innovators have developed critical thinking, collaboration, and creativity skills that will serve them well beyond the classroom. We look forward to continued exploration and growth in the months ahead.

World Environment Day - A Celebration of Awareness, Action and Responsibility

To mark World Environment Day, Ryan International Academy, Hinjawadi organised a vibrant series of activities across all grades on 5th June 2025. The objective was to foster environmental awareness, encourage sustainable practices, and empower students to take active responsibility for their surroundings.

The day began with a special assembly where students from Grade I & II presented interesting facts about the environment, Grades III to V delivered a powerful skit on environmental protection, and students from Grades VI to IX captivated the audience with a dynamic dance performance on an environment-themed song.

Hands-on eco-friendly activities followed throughout the day. Students of Grade I & II designed newspaper bags with "Go Green" messages and nature-inspired decorations. Grades III to V engaged in a Dry Leaf Art activity, using fallen leaves to create beautiful nature scenes. Through engaging and informative discussions, staff members were equipped with the knowledge, tools, and confidence to respond promptly and sensitively to any child protection issue.

Bullying Awareness and Prevention Session Empowers Students

On 12th June 2025, Ryan International Academy, Hinjawadi conducted a meaningful and age-appropriate session on Bullying Awareness and Prevention for students of Grades III to IX. The initiative aimed to promote empathy, kindness, and the courage to stand up against unkind behaviour, reinforcing the importance of a safe and inclusive school environment.

The session was inaugurated by Principal Ms. Sonika Kochhar Girotra, who stressed the school's commitment to ensuring every student feels secure and respected. The programme was led by Ms. Palak Modi, a trained counsellor from Health Basix, and was thoughtfully delivered in two sessions tailored to the respective age groups.

In the first session for Grades III to V, children were introduced to the concepts of friendship, kindness, and the importance of speaking up. Using role plays, storytelling, and interactive activities, the message was clear and simple: Be a Buddy, Not a Bully.

The second session for Grades VI to IX delved into more complex issues such as verbal, social, and cyberbullying. Students discussed real-life scenarios, learned how to be *Upstanders* rather than bystanders, and gained valuable insights into digital responsibility and peer support.

A concluding Q&A session provided practical strategies for recognising, reporting, and addressing bullying. Students left empowered, informed, and ready to contribute to a safer and more compassionate school environment.

These sessions served as a vital reminder that every student's voice matters — and that together, we can build a community where kindness, respect, and support are the norm.
