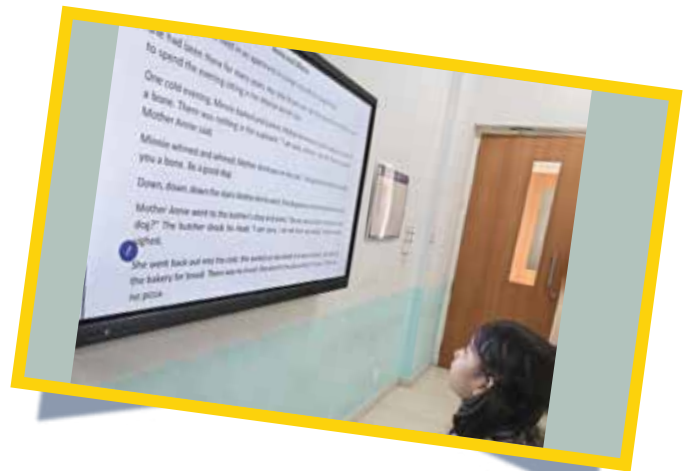
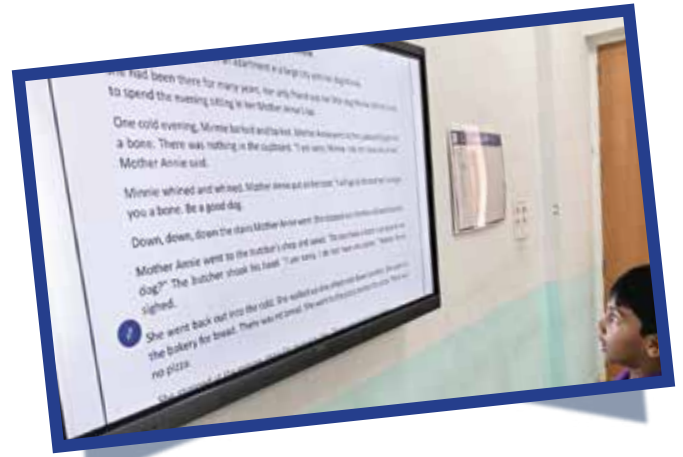
Adapting Through Language
