Other School Activities

Some of the other school activities include assembly activities and birthdays which are special but birthdays at Ryan are even more special. Our students present a sapling to the school on the occasion of their birthdays and take their responsibility towards the environment.

Assembly Activities

Here children perform the assembly exercises demonstrated, toys and props are used by Mont kids and higher class children actively participate in the assembly with prayer and worship songs.

Innovation Lab Activities

Activities are enhancing the creativity and learning of the children by giving them hands-on experience.

- Students made a Throw Fired Glider Mont III: Students will be able to identify and explain basic aerodynamic principles such as lift, drag, thrust (from the throw), and weight, and how they interact to affect glider flight.
- Catapult Grade II: Students successfully made a Catapult using popsicle sticks, rubber bands and corrugated sheet.

Learning Outcome: Students will be able to apply fundamental engineering principles, including the mechanics of levers and energy transfer, to design, construct, and test a functional catapult using provided materials, demonstrating an understanding of how design choices impact performance.









Innovation Lab Activity

 Creating an Amusement Park with Merry-Go-Round (Rotational Motion Project), Ferris Wheel Model (Motorized), Trampolene, and zipline - Grade III: Students made different amusement park rides

Learning Outcome: Students will be able to apply engineering design principles to successfully conceptualize, design, construct, and test functional prototypes of various amusement park rides, demonstrating an understanding of mechanical systems, structural integrity, and safety considerations.

• Laser based home security system - Grade IV: Students made a Laser based home security system.

Learning Outcome: Students will be able to design, construct, and calibrate a functional laser-based intrusion detection system, demonstrating an understanding of how to integrate a laser emitter with a light-sensitive sensor and an alarm mechanism to detect beam interruption and trigger an alert.

• Introduction to Relay & Relay Based Circuit, DC Motor Pump With Relay - Grade V: Students made a Automatic water dispenser using relay module and DC motor pump

Learning Outcome: Students will be able to design, construct, and troubleshoot a functional automatic water dispensing system, demonstrating an understanding of how to integrate a DC motor pump with a relay module for controlled fluid delivery based on an external trigger.



Innovation Lab Activity

Engine Model and use of pistons Grade VI: Students successfully made engine model

Learning Outcome: Mechanical Advantage and Linkages: Appreciating how the arrangement of components creates a working system, including the principles of levers and linkages.

• Smart Dustbin for classroom - Wet and Dry Waste Segregation System - Grade VII: Students successfully made a smart dustbin

Learning Outcome: Robotics & Automation Fundamentals: Students will be able to explain basic principles of robotics, including sensing, actuation, and control loops, as applied in an automated system.

Passion Building

We offer our students the chance to explore creative and life-enriching skills beyond their academic curriculum, helping them discover hidden talents and passions. In **Revival of Lost Art**, students are currently learning the traditional **Warli art** of Maharashtra — a unique tribal style that uses simple geometric patterns to depict scenes of farming, festivals, animals, and everyday village life. Through this initiative, they not only preserve cultural heritage but also develop patience, precision, and an eye for detail.

In **Eco Gardening,** students engage in activities like planting medicinal herbs such as tulsi and aloe vera, creating vertical gardens using recycled bottles, and growing seasonal vegetables in small patches within

the school premises. This teaches them sustainability, responsibility, and the joy of nurturing life. **Home Science** introduces practical life skills such as basic cooking, healthy meal planning, sewing simple fabric items, and organizing household spaces, fostering self-reliance and creativity. Together, these activities build a strong foundation for both personal growth and community contribution.

Vocational Initiatives

Vocational Initiatives at Ryan International Academy provide students with opportunities to acquire skills beyond the regular curriculum, nurturing creativity, communication, and technical expertise. In Helen O'Grady Speech and Drama, students learn to express themselves confidently through voice modulation, body language, improvisation, and role play. These sessions not only enhance public speaking skills but also encourage teamwork, empathy, and creative thinking, shaping them into articulate and self-assured individuals.

In **French**, students explore the beauty of a new language by learning everyday vocabulary, conversational phrases, and cultural nuances, enabling them to communicate effectively and appreciate global diversity. Meanwhile, **Start Coding** introduces them to the fundamentals of programming, logical thinking, and problem-solving, preparing them for future technological advancements. Together, these initiatives equip our learners with life skills, global awareness, and a strong foundation for academic and professional success.


