The Montessori section participated in a card-making competition.


The young students showcased their creativity by designing beautiful cards for their fathers.

Each of these activities were designed to be interactive and engaging, ensuring that students not only learned new language skills but also enjoyed the process of learning.






PARENT'S CORNER
