Here's a guide for educators and parents on how to use clay dough to teach shapes in a Montessori environment:

- Clay dough (store-bought or homemade)
- **Tools:** Small rolling pins, plastic knives, cookie cutters, toothpicks, and child-safe scissors
- **Surface:** A clean, flat working surface (e.g., a wooden tray or mat)
