Our classrooms are abuzz with curiosity and creativity. The Montessori method encourages independence, and our children are thriving as they learn to make choices, solve problems,




and collaborate with their peers. This month, our focus on practical life skills has empowered students to manage tasks with confidence, fostering a sense of responsibility and self-esteem.
