ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Counting Numbers from 1 to 10 with Ice Cream Making Activity - Mont I

Number Recognition: Children will learn to recognize the numbers from 1 to 10.

Counting Skills: By adding scoops to the cones and counting out loud, children will practice one-to-one correspondence.

Fine Motor Skills: The activity involves placing scoops on cones, helping children refine their hand-eye coordination and fine motor skills.

Activity of Making Ice Cream: For each number, children added the correct number of scoops of ice cream to their paper cone. Example: For the number 1, place 1 scoop of ice cream on the cone. For the number 2, place 2 scoops, and so on, up to 10.

The children were encouraged to count aloud as they place each scoop on their cone. This reinforces the concept of one-to-one correspondence and helps with counting skills.

This ice cream-making activity not only makes counting fun but also encourages creativity and hands-on learning.



ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Matching and Identifying Upper and Lower Case letters - Mont II

Matching and identifying upper and lower case alphabets is a key literacy skill for young learners. This ability helps children connect the two forms of each letter, building the foundation for reading and writing. Recognizing that 'A' and 'a' or 'B' and 'b' represent the same letter enhances reading fluency and comprehension while understanding their relationship aids in developing proper writing habits.

Despite its importance, this skill can be challenging for children. Some letters, like 'C' and 'c' or 'O' and 'o,' have similar shapes in both forms and are easier to identify.

However, letters such as 'G' and 'g' or 'Q' and 'q' can appear significantly different, confusing. Additionally, limited exposure to both forms in early learning materials may delay the ability to match them.

To make learning engaging, teachers use interactive activities. Matching games with flashcards or magnetic letters allow children to practice pairing upper and lower case letters. Tracing exercises help internalize the shapes of both forms, while

puzzles and hands-on activities, like pairing blocks or objects, make the process enjoyable. Songs, rhymes, and picture books featuring both cases further reinforce learning in a fun and memorable way.



Regular practice not only strengthens letter recognition but also builds confidence in literacy skills. Children who master this skill can transition smoothly to more advanced tasks, such as phonics, word recognition, and sentence construction.

Matching and identifying upper and lower case alphabets is a vital step in early education. With engaging methods and consistent practice, children can develop this skill effectively, ensuring they are well-prepared for future reading and writing Challenges.

Master the Ball, Own the Game. Every Dribble Counts Mont III

Dribbling in football is an important skill that helps players move the ball while maintaining control. For Montessori students, dribbling can be a fun and engaging activity that encourages both physical movement and concentration. In a Montessori setting, the focus is on creating an environment where children can explore and develop their skills at their own pace.

Dribbling is when a player uses their feet to push or tap the ball forward while walking, running, or changing direction. This allows players to move the ball across the field and avoid opponents. In a Montessori context, it is best to introduce dribbling as a gentle, controlled movement rather than a competitive activity.

Benefits for Montessori Students:

Gross Motor Skills: Dribbling helps children develop strength, coordination, and balance by moving their bodies and controlling the ball with their feet.

Concentration and Focus: As students practice dribbling, they need to pay attention to the ball, their feet, and their surroundings, which helps improve focus and attention span.

Independence: The Montessori approach encourages children to take ownership of their learning. Dribbling allows them to work independently, exploring different ways to move the ball and improve their skills at their own pace.

Social Skills: When children practice dribbling together, they learn cooperation and teamwork. They can share the ball, practice passing, and take turns, which fosters social interaction and group play.


Where Words Fail, Music Speaks - Nurturing Hearts and Minds in Harmony Mont III


PARENT'S CORNER
