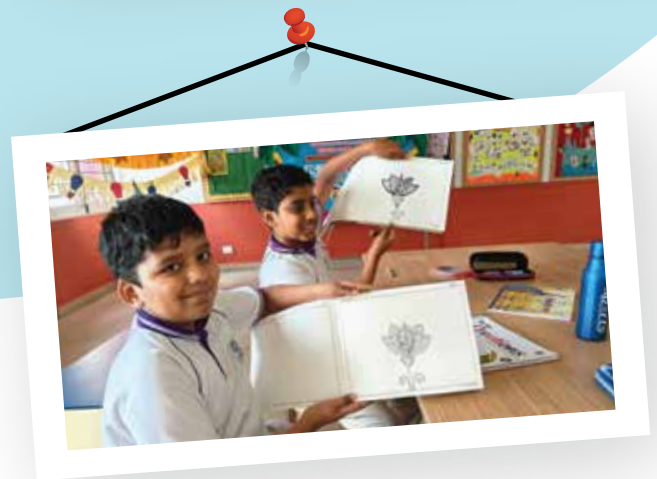
REVIVAL OF LOST ART – Students Embrace Madhubani Art

- Learns important life skills like sportsmanship and discipline

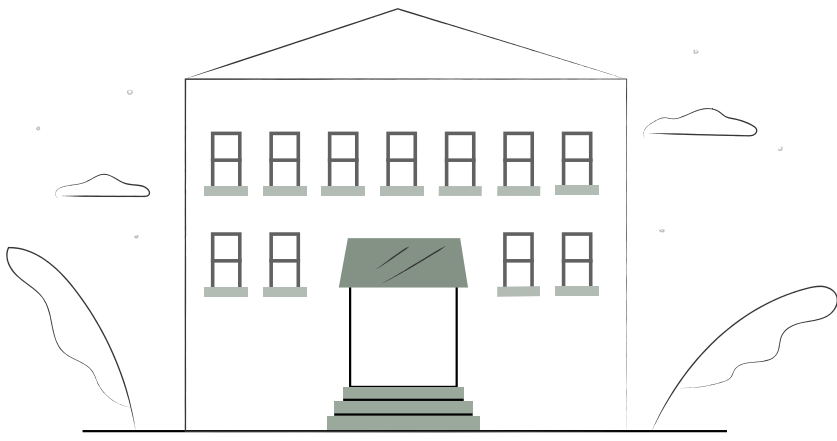
Academic Benefits:

The Never-Ending Plastic Age

Often when we buy a bottle of water or order food that arrives in plastic containers we don't bother much, and even don't mind paying a little extra. Whether to keep our food fresh or our homes insulated and safe, we have relied on plastics to make our lives better. We've become so addicted to them that it's almost impossible to think about a plastic-free life. Plastic items were made popular in India somewhere in the 1980s and since have been an integral part of our life in some way or the other.

In recent studies scientists have found microplastics in the human body. Microplastics, defined as a piece of plastic less than 5 millimeters in length have made their way into the human body through polluted water, food and air. These complex compounds are linked to serious health issues such as endocrine disruption, weight gain, insulin resistance, decreased reproductive health, and cancer.

It is said that plastic waste can take anywhere from 20 to 500 years to decompose, and even then, it never fully disappears; it just gets smaller and smaller. One of the most worrying impacts of pollution on the environment is that there will be more plastic in our oceans than fishes by the year 2050.

Let us pledge to say no to single use plastic items such as pet water bottles, straws, polythene bags, etc., and re-use whatever we may have at home.
