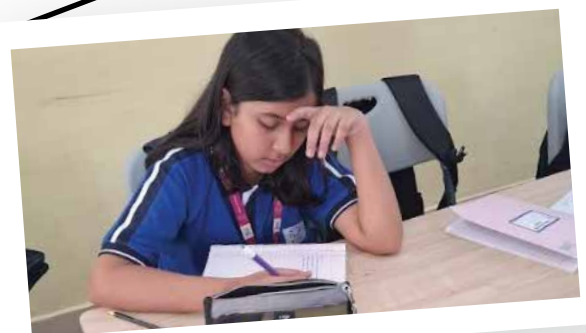

National Education Day Grades I to VII

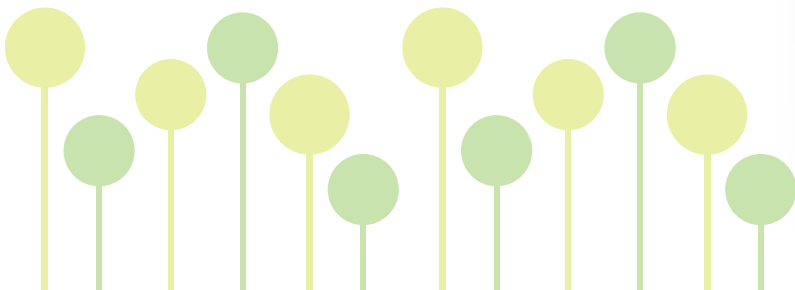
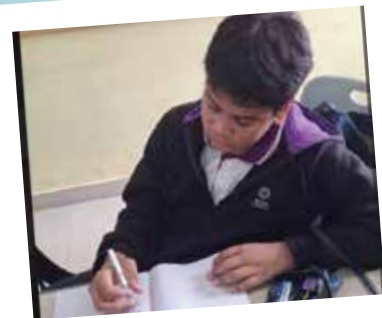
"Learning for Lasting Peace"

Cheers with a glass of milk!"**



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National Milk Day was celebrated at Ryan International Academy, Sarjapur on November 27th 2024 to honour the legacy of Dr. Verghese Kurien, who is known as the "Father of the White Revolution" in India. It's also a day to recognize the hard work of farmers and those who contributed to the dairy industry.

To mark the importance of this day, competitions were conducted at different grade levels. The aim of the competition was to deliver the nutritional benefits of milk and dairy products, which are rich in calcium, protein, and other essential nutrients among students that contribute to strong bones and overall health.

Grade I and II students participated in a drawing competition related to the source of milk. This activity improves learners' creative, artistic and analytical skills. Grades III to V students participated in the role-play competition on the topic: Dr. Verghese Kurien, the "Father of the White Revolution in India." Students learned about the White Revolution and how it transformed India from a milk-deficient nation to the world's largest producer of milk. It boosts their confidence and also enhances learners' presentation and oratory skills. Grade VI & VII students participated in a "Milk Recipe Challenge" where participants created dishes using milk as a primary ingredient. There was a display of beverages and desserts by students. Art, hands-on activity and role-play integration on the National Milk Day celebration improves the quality of learning about the origin, discovery and benefits of milk by giving learners a pragmatic approach. Learners gained insights into the source of milk, the importance of milk and dairy products in our daily diet. They also learned about the Operation Flood initiative, which made India self-sufficient in dairy production.



ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Experiential Learning Activity - Grade IV 'A' & 'B'

The students of grade IV participated in an engaging and hands-on learning activity to explore the concepts of solute, solvent, and solution. The session was designed to help them understand these scientific terms through observation and experimentation.

During the activity, the students worked in groups to mix different substances with water. They learned that the substance that dissolves (e.g., salt or sugar) is called the solute, while the liquid in which it dissolves (e.g., water) is called the solvent. When the solute and solvent combine, they form a solution.

This experiential approach allowed the students to connect theoretical knowledge with practical experiences, making the learning process more effective and enjoyable. The grade IV students demonstrated excellent teamwork and curiosity throughout the session, successfully deepening their understanding of these key scientific concepts.



INNOVATION ACADEMY

Laser-Based Security System - Grade III

By performing the activity students learned how modern security systems use technology to detect intrusions and the practical applications of lasers in real-world scenarios. How lasers work and their properties, such as reflection, refraction, and beam alignment. Explored the importance of precise alignment in systems that use light. Learned to work with photodetectors (e.g., LDRs, photodiodes) and understand how they detect light. Understood the working of basic electronic components like resistors, buzzers, LEDs, and transistors. Apply logic to design circuits that trigger an alarm when the laser beam is interrupted.

Education is one of the most powerful tools we have to shape our future. It's not just about memorizing facts or taking exams—it's about learning how to think, explore, and grow.

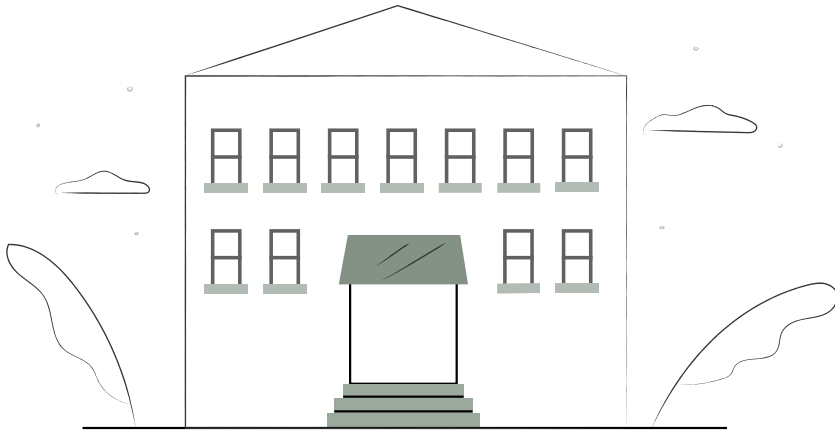
