
The Indian Government Grade V

Through this hands-on activity, they not only understood the working and safety importance of a fuse but also deepened their knowledge of the heating effect of electric current. The activity made learning practical, engaging, and memorable.

Design a Plant from its Parts - Grade III

Students of Grade III at Ryan International Academy, Sarjapur, enthusiastically participated in the experiential learning activity "Design a Plant from its Parts."

This engaging hands-on activity enabled them to identify and understand the different parts of a plant, while also exploring the two types of roots – tap roots and fibrous roots. The experience not only deepened their knowledge of plants but also made learning interactive and fun!



Innovation Academy

This month, from Grades I to VIII, students continued their journey of discovery through engaging hands-on science and engineering projects. In Grade I, children explored the magic of light and reflection by creating Pepper's Ghost Illusion, a project that blended science with creativity. Grade II focused on sustainability by designing a Paper Recycling Station, learning how waste paper can be transformed into new usable sheets, while Grade III applied renewable energy concepts by building Solar-Powered Street Lights.

As students advanced, their projects became more complex and challenging. Grade IV constructed a Solar-Powered Cart, applying principles of motion and solar energy conversion. Grade V learned about sound and electronics by building a Mini Mic Amplifier, while Grade VI discovered how footsteps could generate power by creating a Step Generator using piezoelectric coins. Grade VII students applied digital technology and problem-solving skills to design an Electronic Voting Machine, emphasizing security and transparency. Finally, Grade VIII students combined coding, sensors, and electronics to create a Smart Door with RFID, providing a practical solution to modern access control.

These projects not only deepened students' understanding of scientific principles but also nurtured their problem-solving abilities, teamwork, and creativity. By connecting theoretical concepts to real-world applications, they were inspired to think critically about how STEM can shape innovative and sustainable solutions for the future.




Balancing Discipline and Friendship with Students
