Patriotism

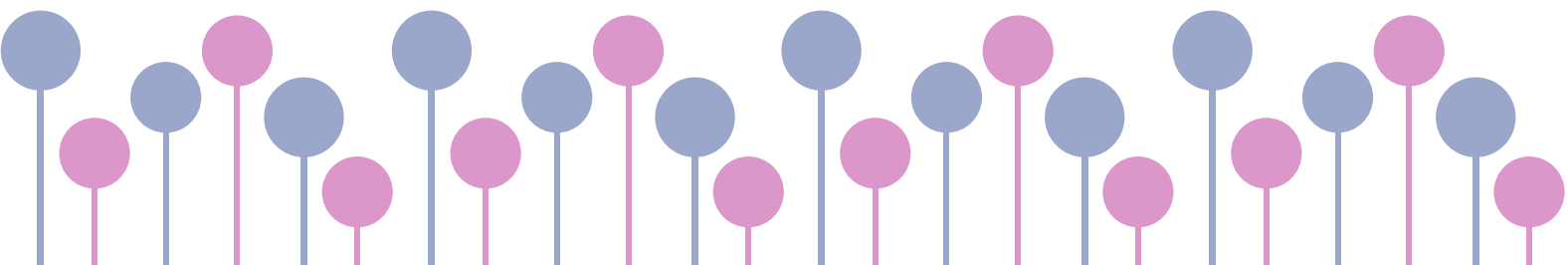

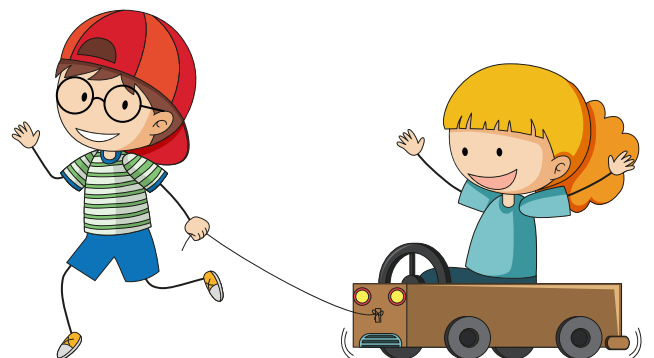
ISRO Day - A Journey into Space

First Aid and Fire Safety

Safety and well-being are of utmost importance in our school, and to ensure that our staff is well-prepared for any emergency, a First Aid and Fire Safety Training session was conducted recently. The training aimed to equip teachers and support staff with essential skills to handle accidents, injuries, and fire-related incidents effectively and confidently. During the session, experts provided hands-on demonstrations on various first aid techniques, including how to treat minor cuts, burns, and sprains, as well as how to respond to more serious injuries while waiting for medical assistance. Staff members were also trained on how to use basic first aid kits, the importance of staying calm, and how to assess and prioritize situations during emergencies. The fire safety segment covered practical steps to prevent fire hazards, use fire extinguishers, and safely evacuate the premises. Participants were shown different types of extinguishers, their proper usage, and evacuation routes in case of a fire emergency.
