Montessori III students gained an understanding of rocket design and launch mechanics through a Straw Rocket project.

Grade I students participated in the Anti-Flood House project, which illustrated the use of floating materials to protect homes and belongings.

Grade II students engaged with circuitry through a wire loop game, comprehending concepts like complete and incomplete circuits, as well as the functionality of sensor systems.


In grade III, the students delved into animations, discerning disparities between 2D and 3D animation using a 3D hologram box.

Through the creation of an Archimedes screw in grade V, students grasped the operational principles and industrial significance of this water-lifting device.

Grade VI students explored gear systems and their control by designing a gear-based soccer robot, gaining hands-on experience with the mechanics. Finally, grade VII students undertook a project involving electromagnetic energy transmission via a Tesla coil. This project enhanced their understanding of electromagnetic power and energy transmission principles.

ECO and Gardening Programme

ECO and Gardening programme is a passion–building initiative at RIAH that serves as a platform for students to come together, learn about environmental issues, and actively contribute to making our school and community more sustainable. This programme imparts knowledge and empowers students to take concrete actions to preserve and protect our planet.

In an era where environmental consciousness is crucial, grade I and II students organized a paper bag-making activity to raise awareness about the detrimental effects of single-use plastic bags on the environment while encouraging the adoption of eco-friendly alternatives. The students made bags from old newspapers and magazines and distributed them to nearby shopkeepers.

Grades III to V students made planters from used old bottles and containers. The objective was to raise awareness about recycling and reducing waste. By creating planters, the students aimed to foster a love for nature and encourage the creation of green spaces. These activities provided an opportunity for students to learn basic gardening skills.











Health, Safety and Child Protection

Teacher's Training on Fire and First-aid

Fire safety training is a crucial component of our commitment to maintaining a secure environment at RIAH. Aligned with our Health Safety and Child Protection (HSCP) Policies, regular fire safety training sessions are conducted for all employees.

For this purpose, we have engaged the expertise of NIST Global Pvt Ltd, Pune for a Staff training on 22nd July 2023. Their skilled trainers impart comprehensive knowledge and essential skills to our staff, ensuring they are well-equipped to prevent fires and respond effectively in case of emergencies.

The training curriculum encompasses a series of presentations and in-depth discussions, covering various facets of fire safety. Participants gain insights into key concepts such as the fire triangle, early fire detection, different types of fires, various extinguishing agents, and the distinct types of fire extinguishers available. Particularly important is the hands-on experience provided on the proper utilization of fire extinguishers.

At RIAH, we believe that fire safety is a collective responsibility. Therefore, our dedicated staff, beyond the designated fire wardens, are equipped with knowledge in fire safety to ensure the protection of our students, which remains our foremost priority.

The training program culminates in a comprehensive fire safety assessment, evaluating the trainees' understanding and application of the concepts covered. Following the successful completion of the assessment, participants were presented with certificates attesting to their training accomplishments.

Staff Training - No Corporal Punishment

RIAH conducted a training session led by HSCP Head Mr. Udayakumar. The aim was to guide teachers in creating a conducive learning environment without resorting to corporal punishment.

The session covered various aspects, starting with understanding corporal punishment's negative effects and legal implications. Mr. Udaya emphasized on positive discipline techniques, including active listening, effective communication, and conflict resolution. The teachers were advised to establish clear classroom expectations collaboratively with students, fostering a sense of responsibility.

Importantly, the training highlighted building strong teacher-student relationships based on trust and respect. De-escalation strategies and emotional regulation techniques were shared to manage challenging situations. Case studies allowed practical application of positive discipline methods. By promoting non-punitive approaches, the training ensured a nurturing and inclusive classroom. Overall, the training equips teachers with valuable tools to create a positive and encouraging environment, enhancing both students' academic growth and personal development.











ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

The English Language Enrichment Programme enhances confidence and communication skills. The main focus of this initiative is to develop proficiency in Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing. This month, the program included various activities and a pre-test administered to new admissions and grade I students.

During the pre-test, students were assessed based on five qualitative aspects of spoken language, which aligned with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR):

Range and Use of Words and Expressions: The ability to use various words and expressions, constructing phrases and sentences.

Accuracy in Grammar: The assessment focused on the correctness of grammatical structures and the formation of accurate sentences.

Fluency: The students' fluency in language usage included the smooth flow of speech and the ability to communicate without prolonged pauses.

Interaction Skills: This aspect involves the student's capability to initiate, participate in, and conclude conversations appropriately. It covers skills such as starting conversations, joining ongoing discussions, and interactions.

Coherence: The ability to maintain coherence in their speech by using appropriate discourse markers, connectors, and conjunctions to link sentences and ideas logically.

The English Language Enrichment Programme aims to cultivate well-rounded language skills in students by addressing the fundamental aspects of language proficiency. This programme seeks to empower students to communicate confidently, accurately, and effectively in English. Grade V 'A' students won the ELEP rolling trophy for the month of July with a total of 218 tallies.


Green Day

World Tiger Day


