English language Day



Experiential learning and application-based programs are integral to the Science curriculum, fostering scientific temperament and a logical thinking. Through Science models, projects, and enrichment activities, students deepen their understanding of concepts. This approach nurtures curiosity, creativity, problem-solving, and inference drawing, paving the way for potential scientists.

The students of grade I identified body parts and their functions, while grade II created the Healthy Plate to classify foods. Grade III engaged in a plant parts activity, and grade V built an aquarium, exploring marine habitats. The students of grade VI conducted nutrient tests in food, and grade VII experimented with soil properties and ph. These hands-on experiences empower students to feel confident and unique, fostering independent learning and critical thinking. By immersing in experiential science, students develop a lifelong love for exploration and discovery.







Class Activities

Innovation Lab

Innovation at RIAH means encouraging students to adopt new technology and creative thinking to add value and drive substantial changes in society. In June, the Innovation Academy engaged students from Montessori 3 to grade VII in various projects.

Young Ryanites of Mont 3 explored properties of magnets wide a magnet car activity, while the students of grade I learned about usage of hydraulic power through a hydraulic jack activity. Grade II students-built windmills to comprehend the utilization of wind energy.

Grade III constructed a hand-operated escalator to understand its mechanism, and grade IV delved into articulated grabber applications.

Grade V focused on metallurgical processes with magnetic waste separators. Grade VI learned about gear systems through simple and compound gear trains.

Lastly, grade VII built 3-speed gearboxes, grasping speed multiplication through combined gears. These hands-on projects fostered innovative thinking, allowing students to explore scientific principles and develop a deeper understanding of various concepts.

Red Day Celebration


