It is felt in every breeze passing by,



Teachers Workshop

This experience provided them with valuable skills and knowledge, inspiring potential careers in journalism. It was a resourceful course that empowered the Young Jourknows with the knowledge of using the overall studio infrastructure to present a News Bulletin as media professionals.

Passion Building Initiatives


Clubs in schools are opportunities for students to explore areas of their interest. They also provide avenues to learn and explore areas that they had not considered interesting earlier. All our Students from grades I to VIII are a part of either of the clubs listed below:

Eco-Gardening Club: Learning to be a responsible individual always connects us to mother nature. This clubs aims to introduce the students to different types of plants. They learn and gather more information about the structure and function of different parts of plants. The students are encouraged to explore and adopt the plantation area in the school premise. They are taught to be caregivers who tend to the needs of the plants and look after them.

Home Science Club: This club aims at imparting knowledge to students about the science of better living. It educates them about basic etiquettes, mannerisms and conduct. It helps in improving the quality of their personal life which in turn would make them contribute towards the betterment of their family and the community at large.

Mystery Science: This club allows students to think critically by exploring new avenues in Science and drawing out new experiences. Mystery Science club provides the students an opportunity to learn about the different scientific disciplines, conduct experiments and participate in various scientific activities. It helps nurture a scientific temperament in the students and thereby cultivate a passion for Science.

Revival of Lost Art: This club aims at reviving some of the art forms that are lost or on the verge of being extinct. The art form chosen by the club for this session is Paitkar, which is a tribal folk painting from the state of Jharkhand, West Bengal and Orissa. They are popularly known as the scroll paintings of the East. The club provides the students an opportunity to explore art and craft forms of various states and regions beyond what is being offered in the curriculum.



Vocational Initiative

Vocational Initiatives that provide Skill enhancement to our students. Few of the vocational initiatives that we are offering to our students from grades I to VIII in this year are:

Coding: This club empowers students with different Modules of Coding which includes introduction to stepwise thinking, logical and critical lab and sequencing. Further on the students will be introduced to Coding Math: Power Base and Number system, Algorithm, Flowchart, Boolean Algebra- and Coding fundamentals -Algorithm 2 Loop, Truth table and Logic gate of NOT, AND, OR, & XOR, components used to create Logic gate.

Speech and Drama by Helen-O-Grady: Speech and drama are stringed with expression and gesture. Learning to use facial expressions and hand gestures along with the breathing and humming exercises make each session interactive. The speech and drama class provides learning with the techniques of forward placing, projection, jaw exercise, and recitation of poems.

French Language: A different language is a different vision of life. Identifying new French vocabulary of "Les objects de la classes" through a drawing activity introduced students to a treasure trove of French vocabulary when they wrote the names of different things that the Students carry in their bags daily to school.

Optional Sports: Apart from the regular sports activities that happen in school, we at RIAB offer Optional Sports for our students. They can pick from a range of sports offered for their particular class. In the month of June, our students enjoyed splashing and learning Swimming, Roller skating, football, Basketball, Table Tennis, and Cricket to name a few.
